Workshop Offerings - Two Options:

I. Life to Eagle Seminar (90 Minutes)

Take a tour of all of the requirements for Eagle Scout. Learn about choosing an Eagle Scout service project, the necessary paperwork, the approval steps, and filling out the Eagle Scout application.
